2-4 credit/advanced level study group or independent study

The purpose of this study is to sharpen students' abilities to read, think, and communicate effectively and critically in academic contexts through writing and other formats of presentation (PowerPoint & Public Speaking). The focus of the course will also include academic/information literacy research strategies applied to the content of another academic study or to a topic agreed upon by the instructor and student. Movement from basic to more advanced development of both the mindset and skill set needed to think critically and engage in sophisticated analysis of issues are the key desired learner outcomes of the study.

2 credit/introductory level independent study and requires attendance at workshops The purpose of this study is to allow students to develop a personalized student success plan through participation in individual appointments and a series of Academic Support workshops. Students will meet individually with the course instructor and participate in the Academic Support/Pieces of Success workshop series in order to better understand how they learn best and to create their own individualized academic success plan for their coursework at Empire State College. Students will be asked to write short reflection papers after each workshop and a final self-analysis paper.

2-4 credit/advanced level/independent study

The purpose of this practicum is for students to develop a theoretical grounding in the field of learning assistance and to engage in practical applications for teaching/training postsecondary learners. Students in the practicum will learn about the scholarship and best practices of college level learning assistance and academic support by reading about and engaging in discussion of academic literature on appropriate theories of adult learning, student engagement, academic skills development, and learning center pedagogy. They will also engage in hands-on practice in assisting college level learners in enhancing general study skills, tutoring in specific content areas, navigating through college resources, and/or developing study strategies and resources within specific Areas of Study or general learning skills development.
